


Chrysanthemum

a genus of about 100 species of annual or perennial herbs of the family Compositae(q.v.); popularly the name given to forms of certain old world species of this genus which have been remarkably developed by cultivation. Most varieties extensively grown by gardeners and florists are blended hybrids or other forms derived from C.morifolium and C.indicum, natives of eastern Asia.

a city of Hartford county, Conn., U.S., 19 mi. S.W. of Hartford on the Pequabuck river. The area was first settled in 1727 as part of Farmington. Organized as a town in 1785, incorporated as a borough in 1893 and chartered as a city in 1911. Population: 60,000.



THE FOLLOWING IS AN EXCERPT FROM THE BRISTOL PRESS, September 23, 1972:

"Why does Bristol hold a Chrysanthemum festival and what gives the city the right to claim the title "Mum City, U.S.A.?"

For thousands of people who annually view the plush six acre carpet of brilliant color that graces Chippens Hill each fall, the answer is obvious. For, thanks to the Bristol Nurseries and its world famous chrysanthemums, Bristol is truly the Mum capital of the world.

The Bristol Nurseries have been a local attraction for over 50 years and long before the concept of the Chrysanthemum Festival was dreamed of, the Bristol Nurseries were delighting thousands with their annual fall display. Today (during the Fall festival), on a good Sunday, the Nurseries will host nearly 10,000 visitors from many states who have come to see the famous mums in display.



The Chrysanthemum Festival, which grew out of the mum display, annually reaches its conclusion with the ceremonies held amidst the mums at the Nurseries on Pinehurst Road. But while the Mum Festival ends about October 15, the display continues in all its brilliance until November 1, when the plants are cut down to begin the yearly cycle of the chrysanthemum development.

The Bristol Nurseries was incorporated in 1920 by Paul Hubbard and Alex Cumming. About 1948, Arthur C. Bird, who had been a manager of the landscaping dept., bought out the interests of Hubbard and turned the real emphasis on the chrysanthemum. Bird's sons now continue the work of their father."

Editor's note:

Though Bristol Nurseries went out of the major mum fields & fields of business in 1986, Jerry, the current mum-man owner, continues to provide Bristol with thousands of mums each year, as do many Bristol shopping areas. The annual fall display of Mum Festival activities and of course, Bristol-bright yards in full color give Bristol entitlement to the "Mum City, U.S.A." claim for ever more!



Bristol, Bristol How Do Your Mum Gardens Grow?

Remove plant from its pot and gently loosen the bottom of the root ball. Plant with the top of the root ball just 1/2 inch deeper in the soil than it was in its pot. Press soil firmly around the root ball, but leave the top soil loose, and water thoroughly. Growth will be best in fertile, well drained soil. Poor soil can be improved with the addition of compost, peat moss or other organic matter. Cover your plant at night in the event of an early frost to preserve the flowering period. Paper or plastic bags work well.

Note: Mums need sun to grow. If you purchase them in bloom, you can plant them wherever you like for display, even in the shade, but you must move them to a sunny location over the spring and summer to achieve good growth. They can be lifted again in the fall and placed wherever you want a display of color.

WINTER Cut old stems down to 4-6 inches. After the ground has frozen, apply 3-4 inches of mulch.

SPRING Gradually remove mulch. Dig up and divide mature clumps to increase your numbers of plants. Any 5-10-10 fertilizer, superphosphate, or bone meal at the rate of one tablespoon per plant will improve growth. When shoots are 4-5 inches tall, pinch off top 3/4 to 1 inch of growth. Repeat this process every 6-8 inches until mid July to encourage attractive, bushy growth.

SUMMER Keep your soil aerated and don't allow it to become hard packed. Water well weekly during dry spells. Fertilize monthly until August. You can mulch with an inch of grass clippings or peat moss to hold down weeds and conserve moisture. If pests develop or leaves turn brown, a complete spray or dust should be applied. Rose sprays and dusts work fine and are readily available at local nurseries.


